The successful candidate will have their paper published in the 2017 edition of the South African Health Review (SAHR). The winner will also receive a cash prize and the opportunity to meet with senior research staff at HST.

Offering a South African perspective on prevailing local and international public health issues, the SAHR combines detailed data on health status and care with in-depth analysis of policies and practices affecting the provision of health services, infused with insights as to degrees of achievement in policy implementation and barriers thereto.

Over its 20-year history, the *SAHR* has become one of HST's forerunning publications, and in 2014, was accredited by the Department of Higher Education as a peer-reviewed journal. The Review is frequently quoted as an authoritative reference work in South Africa and abroad.

## The following criteria will be considered in the assessment of submitted chapters:

- The paper should be well written and comprehensive in range and depth.
- The topic should be relevant to the local and international public health community and current policy environment in South Africa.
- The manuscript should demonstrate scientific rigour and intellectual clarity.
- > The degree of innovation and originality represented in the piece will be measured.
- > Identification of good practices and hindrances to policy implementation, as well as possible implications for policy reform, would strengthen the paper.

The Award is offered to South African citizens or permanent residents who are under the age of 35 on 28 February 2017. The applicant should be first author on the paper. Any other authors may only be cited in a supervisory capacity.
