Target audience for the course

The course is aimed at professionals in all fields, policy makers and implementers at national, provincial and municipal levels of government offices, non-governmental organizations, disabled people organizations, principals of school, academics, project managers and university students.

Expected Learning Outcomes

Demonstrate principles of record keeping, use of a various participatory rural appraisal methods, communicating messages and identifying relevant support services with an application in a community reasoning cycle.

Specific learning outcomes

1. What is a record, why is it important to keep good records and what are the principles of record keeping?
2. Demonstrate use of Participatory Rural Appraisal (PRA) as part of record keeping.
3. Demonstrate use of community reasoning cycle, using support structures to inform the process.
4. Communication, disseminating information using visual aids.

Course structure

The course is for three days and is structured to be interactive consisting of seminars, small group discussions, presentations and activities. These activities will focus on the principles of record keeping,

and using Participatory Rural Appraisal (PRA) methods to gather information. Participants will then go through the community reasoning cycle while identifying relevant support structures that informs the reasoning cycle. Finally, communication as a means to disseminate messages using visual aids will be discussed.

Course programme and readings will be sent out before students arrive for the course and these readings will be integrated into the seminars and discussions in class.

A certificate of attendance will be given at the end of the course. CPD accreditation has been applied for from Health Professional council of South Africa (HPCSA) and South African Council for Social Service Professions (SACSSP).
