His academic interests include social psychiatry and the environment, Recovery in Mental Illness and Mindfulness Based Interventions.

Topic:

Climate Change and Mental Health in South Africa – What can we expect? What can we do?

As Climate Change becomes an undeniable and rapidly evolving part of all of our futures, it is incumbent upon the members of every discipline to be considering its implications. What does this mean for us and how best should we respond? This talk will present the preliminary findings of a literature review on the subject, looking at evidence for direct and indirect effects of climate change on mental health and will also raise some interesting questions on what this means for the future of mental health care and our roles in Mitigation and Adaptation.
