Colloquium Objectives

The aim of the colloquium is to develop a more comprehensive understanding of homicide (with a particular focus on South Africa). Homicide will be the central focus of this event, but it will also explore those factors and dynamics that contribute to lethal violence. In this regard this event will seek to bring together researchers, those who work in the criminal justice and related sectors, policy makers and violence prevention practioners and activists. In addition, the colloquium will be used as a platform to launch SaVI's Interdisciplinary Homicide Research Programme.

A select number of paper authors will be invited to have their papers included in an edited book on homicide in South Africa.

Submission Requirements

Abstracts should be no longer than 300 words in which you list a title; and clearly state the research objectives, methodology and findings. In addition, please include your bio and contact details. No honorarium or speaker fee will be paid to colloquium presenters. Successful applicants will be informed by 22 July 2015. The deadline for the submission of colloquium papers will be 28 August 2015.
