# **Discussion 2: Exploring constructions of "African"**

### 1. Objectives of class:

- Explore the idea of social construction
- Explore the construction of "African"
- Explore the intersectionality of "African" and race
- Develop an understanding that there are "things at stake" (i.e. relationships of power) in these constructions
