ASSA Media Report

Overview

This report is a record of the 278 electronic articles in South African media that contain the string of letters 'actuar', for the period of 1 July 2018 to 30 September 2018. Please contact Pieter du Toit (pddutoit@gmail.com) or Billy Enderstein (billy.enderstein@gmail.com) to get access to the full database of articles.

198 of these articles appear in media sources that do not receive very high circulation (e.g. local newspapers, blogs and special interest web pages). These articles are only discussed in the very last section of this report.

The intended audience of the report includes members and employees of the Actuarial Society of South Africa and participants of Mind Matters.

1.1. Articles initiated by ASSA

In <u>this</u> article, the Actuarial Society in partnership with Paper Video highlighted the free online access given to Grade 10 pupils to improve in subjects such as Mathematics and Science. Mike McDougall, the CEO of ASSA, then pointed out that an improvement in these subjects can open doors to skills in high demand such as actuarial science.

1.2. Financial sector urged to benefit the society

This is the call echoed by independent actuary, Rob Rusconi, in three articles.

In <u>this</u> article, a model proposed by Alexander Forbes is discussed with the aim of helping members save for both retirement and emergency savings.

• Why we must put insurers' data to work against crime

The article above is an opinion piece that stressed the need for the insurance industry to share valuable data in order to benefit society.

 Another <u>article</u> Beyond the Knysna catastrophe a new vision, suggested a possible partnership between the private and public sectors. This is in order to have insurance provision for the assets of citizens, especially after disasters and other risks with a high cost attached to them.

1.3. Actuaries quoted as experts in different fields and giving financial advice

- In a <u>News24 article</u>, studies done by actuaries at the Medical Research Board and Rob Rusconi's views are consulted as to other viable options rather than investing retirement savings into capital markets.
- Four articles in August focused on financial advice for women.
 Karen Bongers, product actuary at Sanlam discussed the topic: <u>Single moms need income protection</u>.

The other 3 articles advised and encouraged women to save for retirement as women, on average, live longer than men. <u>Here</u> is an example.

Six articles deal with the proposed Road Accident Benefit Scheme (RABS) Bill.
 In an IOL <u>article</u>, ASSA and individual actuaries called for a review of the report that justifies that RABS is affordable.

This article mentioned that:

"The department's own actuaries' estimation of the implications on the fuel levy in terms of the anticipated funding requirements for RABS reveals that significant increases to the fuel levy are anticipated."

Is consolidation treating customers fairly?

Actuaries Alison Counihan and Roshan Bhana of Alexander Forbes Health shared their views on consolidating smaller medical schemes into larger schemes in the article above.

- A quote from an <u>article</u> stated that Shivani Ranchod, actuary and CEO of Percept, "was contracted by the Council for Medical Schemes (CMS) to help it with consolidating the 83 medical schemes and their 323 options into fewer, bigger, stronger and more affordable schemes and options."
- Actuaries in ASSA's investment committee are regarded as experts in analysing the returns of equity funds over a 10 year period in this article.



There were 198 articles with the string "actuar" that appeared in South African media with low circulation figures.

49 of the 198 articles were written by Ian Stiglingh on Sharenet. These articles shared results and updates of markets all around the world. These 49 articles all ended off with a summary of the author which included his role as an intern at Old Mutual Actuaries & Consultants when he was a Student. Stiglingh writes on a regular basis and his articles do have value, although there is seldom a direct link to actuarial science. See this example.
